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- 2 Q. Did you approve the payment of fees to 3 entities in Nevis who would be acting as the registered agent? 4
 - A. I could have done, but I don't know.
- 6 Q. Have you signed any of the documents to 7 create these entities?
 - A. I could have, but I don't know.
- 9 Q. Have you signed any of the annual reports 10 for these entities?
- 11 A. No, I haven't, not that I know of.
- 12 Q. When IAS sold shares to investors, how were 13 the shares issued? Were they stock certificates or 14 were they book entry shares?
- A. Well, if they personally sold stock, they 15 16 would usually have a board of directors' meeting issuing the stock, and then they would give that -- a 17 document to the transfer agent and then they would 18 19 prepare the stock.
- 20 Q. So when stock certificates were issued, 21 were those issued by the transfer agent?
- 22 A. That's correct.
- 23 Q. And were stock certificates issued when 24 someone purchased stock?
- 25 A. Yes, I think so. That's where yours came

Q. Who are they?

- 2 A. I don't know them. I don't really know. I don't know how they become market makers or not. 3
 - Q. In the Annual Report, the 10-K, it identifies the auditors as Pinaki & Associates of Newark, Delaware. Does that sound familiar?
- 7 A. I suppose. I don't know what date that 8 you're referring to.
 - Q. Let's look. Find Exhibit 2055. Turn to page 37.
 - A. 37. Okay. Okay.
 - Q. Do you see this it says Independent Auditor's Report from Pinaki & Associates?
 - A. All right. I didn't know they were out of Newark. I never looked at it before.
 - Q. How was this firm selected to be the independent auditors for IAS?
- 18 A. I probably picked them, but I don't 19 remember who the names were.
 - Q. And how did you pick them?
- 21 A. I don't remember just how. Probably was 22 looking at different companies and called around and 23 these people said they would do the work.
 - Q. We talked earlier about your having signed this report. Do you remember that discussion?

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- from or the -- I mean the ones that go to the 1 2 Solstice group.
- 3 Q. Did IAS keep a record of all the stock that 4 was issued?
- 5 A. I don't know. I would assume they would, but they would rely upon the stock transfer agent for 6 7 most of that.
 - Q. Did IAS keep a stock ledger book?
 - A. No, they didn't ever do that.
- 10 Q. How did IAS know who their shareholders 11 were?
- 12 A. They would have to contact the transfer 13 agent.
- 14 Q. And was that Pacific Stock Transfer?
- A. Started out -- no, it wasn't originally 15 that. It was something else, and they sold it over
- to those people not too long ago, actually, but --17 18 Q. Have you had any discussions with anybody
- at Pacific Stock Transfer in the last six months? 19
- 20 A. I've never talked to anybody over there as 21 far as I know.
- 22 Q. Do you know whether there are any 23 market makers for the company?
- A. There's one, but I don't know. There may 24 25 be two or three.

- 1 A. I do.
 - 2 Q. When you signed the Annual Report and 3 approved its submission to the SEC, was all the 4 information in the 10-K accurate?
 - A. There's never a hundred percent, just like the fact is I didn't own real estate, but as far as I could determine and read through this and grasp the information, I believe that it's accurate.
 - Q. So what things have you since decided might 10 be inaccurate -- that you learned since then that 11 might be inaccurate?
 - A. Well, I'm not sure. And we need to maybe 13 evaluate some things. I'm not sure that all of the contracts are represented properly, but that's 14 something we're going to have to look through now. I
 - didn't recognize that, but I will. 16
 - 17 Q. Turn to page 33, please. 18
 - A. Okay.
 - 19 Q. It says there that Neldon Johnson,
 - 20 President, CEO, and Director was the beneficial owner
 - 21 of 94.3 million shares. Do you see that?
 - 22 A. I do.
 - Q. Was that accurate in 2016?
 - A. Yes, it was. 24
 - 25 Q. Is it accurate now?

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1 A. It is.

- 2 Q. Have you sold any shares since 2016?
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- 4 Q. Where are those shares now?
- 5 A. Well, these are warrants. They're not --
- when they talk about shares, they're talking about 6
- 7 the combination, not just common stock. They're
- 8 talking about all of the shares -- the voting
- 9 shares -- I don't have any common stock that I know 10
- 11 Q. The footnote one says the 94.3 million 12 number includes warrants to purchase 93.3 million 13 shares of common stock.
 - A. That's correct.
 - Q. Which would suggest to me that when you deduct the 93.3 million that there is still a million hundred and five thousand twenty shares of stock?
- A. That's preferred stock, and that's voting 18 19 rights. There's no -- you can't sell them.
- 20 Q. Do you have stock certificates representing those preferred shares?
- 22 A. These aren't even mine. They belong to 23 Starlight and Black Night, but they leave them in
- there because of the fact that the stockholders would 24
- 25 like to know that the CEO and that is there, but they

 - A. No, it wasn't.
 - Q. So you do not own any shares or warrants in
 - 3 IAS? Is that what you're saying?
 - A. That's true.
 - 5 Q. Is that because they were all transferred
 - 6 to Black Night and Starlight?
 - A. That's correct.
 - Q. Then should there have been a disclosure in
 - here that you own no shares and that the 94.3 million
 - 10 shares and warrants are owned by foreign companies?
 - A. Yes, there should have been.
 - 12 Q. Why was that not done?
 - A. Because I'm -- I didn't take care of it
 - 14 properly. It was something that I overlooked as I
 - 15 was reading the documents, and somehow when I got
 - there I didn't -- I have three sets of accountants,
 - and I assume those accountants are going to take care
 - 18 of the things that are going on in the company.
 - 19 And I didn't think that three accounting 20 firms would make that kind of mistake, and that's my
 - 21 problem, and I should have taken care of it. That's
 - 22 not -- I can't do anything about that.
 - Q. This indicates that Randale Johnson beneficially owns 450,000 shares and options.

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A. He could do.

know that they're not mine. They know they're in a

- 3 Q. How do the shareholders know that?
- 4 A. Well, shareholders don't, but the auditors
- 5 I believe do, and they're the ones who felt like it
- was okay to do that. So I am not sure why they did 6
- it or why they didn't do it, but that's just how they 7

- 9 Q. Are you saying in reality you do not own 10 any preferred shares or warrants?
- 11 A. I don't own anything.
- 12 Q. And so the decision -- so did you decide to
- state that you do beneficially control 94 million 13
- 14 shares and warrants because the shareholders would be
- unhappy if they learned that the shares were owned by 15
- 16 a company in Nevis?
- 17 A. No, I'm not saying that at all.
- 18 Q. Tell me what -- because I'm seeing a
- disconnect. You're telling me you own no shares and 19
- no warrants, and the 10-K, which is signed under 20
- oath, says that you beneficially own 94.3 million 21
- 22 shares and warrants.

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- 23 A. Right. And that needs to be changed
- 24 obviously, but right now that's just the way it is.
 - Q. Was this correct at the time you signed it?

- Q. Does he still own that?
- 2 A. I believe he does, yes, but I -- I'm not

- 17 Q. Are those shares -- are there certificates representing those preferred shares?
- 18
- 19 A. I don't know. I have no idea, but I do
- 20 know that that -- that you can't market them.
- 21 Q. If there are certificates representing 22 those shares, where are those certificates presently?
- 23 A. Probably in the possession of whoever
- 24 owns -- controls Starlight and Black Night. It could
- 25 be in Nevis. I don't even know.
